Principal's Report

The purpose of council is to manage school governance, secure the long term financial viability of the school and to ensure the college works within DET policies. I'd like to take this opportunity to personally thank our council members for dedicating their time, energy and expertise into the future direction of our school.

COVID-19

We are aware that COVID cases are continuing to occur throughout our community and we remind all parents and carers that the DET requires you to report any cases of COVID-19 infection in students to the college. Also, if your child is required to isolate due to another member of the household contracting COVID-19, you are required to inform us of this circumstance also.

As we enter the colder months we are expecting case numbers to continue and we appeal to all families to please inform us when your child's school attendance is impacted.

Principal's Report continued

Attendance

In the state of Victoria, all parents and carers have a legal obligation to ensure your child is enrolled in school and attending every day until they are 17 years of age.

Unfortunately, consistent school attendance still seems to be an issue for some students. We currently have far too many students whose attendance is well under 80%. This equates to an average of one or more days off per week.

In the 6 years of secondary schooling this can very quickly equate to years of missed learning and drastically reduced outcomes for your child. These reduced outcomes will have a direct impact on your child's employability and post-secondary educational options.

In order to address this important issue, the college will need to action some important steps to support our young people to remain in class and learning. From this point forward, only students who are maintaining a minimum of 85% attendance will be able to participate in the college's extra-curricula activities including sports teams, performances and some camps and excursions.

The college is currently exploring other options to support students and families to manage school attendance including the introduction of morning homerooms.

Recently, the Department of Education & Training (DET) has identified some CSC students whose attendance is too low. This may require the DET to pass the names of those families on to the Department of Human Services for assistance. Sometimes this follow-up can include a loss of government supports until the child's attendance at school is back up to an acceptable level.

If your child is absent from school for any reason, please ensure that you inform the college of the reason for the absence. This can be done through Compass or by simply phoning the school.

Uniform

Thank you to those parents and carers who took advantage of the discounts on offer in our recent uniform sale. The response has been overwhelming!

Like all schools in the state, the CSC Council has determined that all students must wear our school uniform. It is great to see more and more students arriving in full school uniform every day.

We are again appealing to all parents and carers to ensure you are providing your child with the prescribed CSC uniform (from our extensive list of items) and assist them to leave your home every morning dressed appropriately. **Students should not be attending school in casual clothes!**

It is vital that our young people learn to take responsibility for the way they present everyday - just as they would be expected to do in the work place. Forming these good habits now will support your child to have a successful future in their chosen career pathway.

During Term 2, students who present out of uniform and without a note can expect follow-up that will include phone calls home to parents and carers to discuss this issue for students who are regularly without the correct uniform.

Finally, I'd like to wish you all the best for the Easter break and my hope is that all our students, families and staff can have a restful holiday and come back feeling refreshed and ready for a productive Term 2.

The last guest of the day was Damien Flemming, a sports commentator and former cricket player. Using significant moments and anecdotes from his career to demonstrate how he acquired resilience.

Employer Expectations

Employers look for and hire people they think will help the company succeed. **Employers** have **expectations** of their team members and will hire people who will most likely meet or exceed **expectations**.

Your job depends on your ability to assist your **employer** to make money. If the business loses money, your job may disappear. At the top of their list of **expectations**, most **employers** would include commitment, enthusiasm, dependability, honesty, and a willingness to learn and accept feedback.

The Top 10 Work Values Employers Look For

- Strong Work Ethic. Employers value employees who understand and possess a willingness to work hard
- Dependability and Responsibility
- Possessing a Positive Attitude
- Adaptability
- Honesty and Integrity
- Self Motivated
- Motivated to Grow and Learn
- Develop Self Confidence
- Excellent Personal Presentation (represent the business)
- Main thing they look for is people who will apply themselves

Where do you look for a job?

- 55% are advertised on recruitment and company websites
- 4% are advertised in newspapers
- 23% are advertised on social media
- 31% are by word of mouth (family, friends co-workers)

Be mindful that potential Employers will contact the school to ask about your attendance, attitude and what sort of person you are.

Be aware when you are in public, of your behaviour and how you present yourself.

Positive and Negative. Eg Sport activities, good behaviour at training and bad (employers in cars watching)

Be really aware of social media and what is on there, and make sure settings are set correctly

Starting your career journey means making some choices!

It's important for you to choose a career that reflects the type of person you are. When you choose a career that matches your natural style you are more productive, happier and less stressed than being in a job that's just "not you".

Start by asking yourself a few simple questions to work out your interests, likes and talents:

- What do I like?
- What do I value?
- What do I believe?
- What are my interests?
- What am I good at?
- What do I enjoy?
- What subjects am I interested in at school?
- What type of environment do I like working in? eg: office or outdoors?

The answers will help you to determine what some of the ideal career options are for you.
